With Joe Smith resuming this week and Vernon Lee in the next round Lakes will be at full strength for the vital last few games.

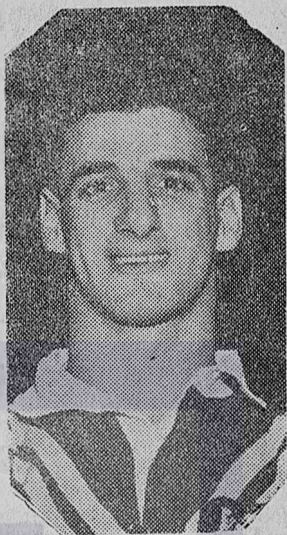
